

PIROPLASMOSIS - (**Note: Testing requirement discontinued 06/01/2011.**) Equidae coming from or originating from any state in which there has been a diagnosed case of piroplasmosis (either *T. Equi* or *B. caballi*) in the past 12 months shall meet the following:

1. Be accompanied by an interstate health certificate or certificate of veterinary inspection that includes the following statement:

***"I have examined the animal/s listed on this certificate. At the time of the examination, the animal/s listed on this certificate is/are not under quarantine for piroplasmosis, not displaying signs of piroplasmosis, and either did not have evidence of live ticks or was/were successfully treated for ticks if ticks were present."***

2. Equine with ticks or evidence of tick infestation shall be treated with a topical pyrethroids or pesticide products registered with the United States Environment Protection Agency for the treatment of ticks in equine.
3. Horses from premises currently under quarantine for piroplasmosis shall not be imported into Michigan.
