I have ridden most of my life and have been exposed to many disciplines. This would include jumping, western pleasure, cutting and saddleseat. All of this was when I was a child. In 1972 I became interested in dressage. Prior to that time it was sort of an "unknown" in the area where I lived. Since then, I have had a very strong commitment to the art and sport of dressage riding and training. Experiences would include the different methodology of the German, French, and Hungarian schools. The biggest eye-opener of my dressage career came in 1988 when I started riding with Karl Mikolka from the Spanish Riding School of Vienna.

Through Karl's deep seated knowledge I received training like I had never imagined. I attained my Silver Medal and was showing my horses at the FEI levels. Also I had one of the top horses in the world in "cavesson training." Presently, I own a Hanoverian stallion. He has been a magnificent horse and is trained in most of the Grand Prix movements. He was going to be shown at Intermediare II when his show career was sidelined due to an injury. I purchased this horse as a jumper in Poland with the vision that he could do upper-level dressage work. With Karl's help, that vision came true.

Where I see my strength as a teacher is the ability to teach a correct seat and usage of the aids and what to expect. My sessions are very positive and I want to instill a passion for classical riding and training. Strengths in training would include a very thorough knowledge of a horse that is on the aids and resistance free. Again, I want this to be a very positive situation for the horse and rider resulting in the horse being well-trained, sound, and a pleasurable companion for many years.

Three years ago I was awarded with the honor of being a Certified Student of Karl Mikolka. He has certified only six people in the US.

Directions to Sunset Acres:

From West of Camden:
Follow I20 East past Columbia to Hwy 521 (Exit 98).
From East of Camden:
Follow I20 West past Florence to Hwy 521 (Exit 98).

Go North on Hwy 521 approximately 6 miles thru Camden. From the blinker light where the truck route joins Hwy 521 it is 1.1 miles to Peck Woods Road on right. Turn right and go approximately 1/2 mile to first drive on the right.
